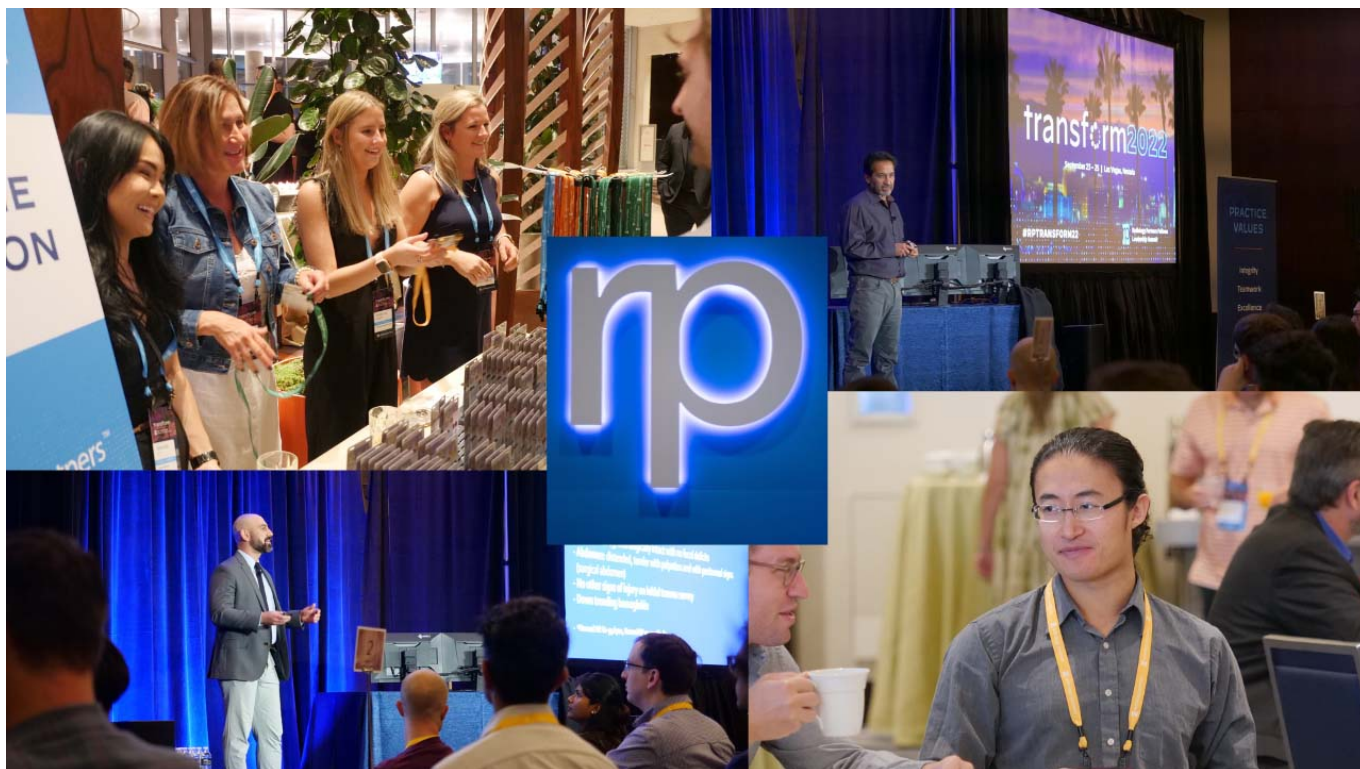




[2022 Transform: Highlights from RP's event connecting trainees and radiology leaders](#)

Dr. Masis Iskbay, resident at the University of California, San Francisco, presented "Alternatives to Surgery: Splenic Embolization in Less Than 20 Minutes to Save a Life."



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The weekend event included educational presentations about our industry and specialty.
